Today I drove to Kennett Square, Penna. to visit the Kennett Square Golf and Country Club at the very urgent requests of P. G. A. member Harry Anderson. It will be recalled that letters from him have been coming in to the office for some time but unfortunately, until now, other engagements prevented me from getting to him. So I was particularly glad to be there today.

The play at this club has been getting so heavy that they face the necessity of extending to an additional nine holes and it was concerning the locations of these and the general plan of developing them that my advice was sought. This I gave them, finding the proposed land entirely adequate and satisfactory. I also discussed costs of construction with Anderson and H. R. Chandler, chairman of the committee, who was with us throughout the day. They also asked for suggestions concerning the present nine holes and after an examination of these my comments seemed to meet with their approval.
