At the request of P. G. A. member Charles Schneider I today paid a visit to the Concord Country Club. I made a complete study of the entire course accompanied by Schneider, John F. Skelly (greenkeeper) and E. C. Huber (chairman of the green committee) I also had opportunity to talk with some of the substantial members of the club, including Irened' du Pont.

The Concord greens are very large, in some instances double the proper size as is the case of the Thirteenth, where I recommended cutting out the entire Front Half of the green. The greens of the Second, Fourth, Twelfth and Fifteenth are likewise too large. I located an entirely new green for the Tenth and a new teeing ground for the Eleventh (on the present Tenth green) Notes were made of my numerous suggestions and I was assured that the service of the P. G. A. was greatly appreciated
